Junior Fellowship Nomination Form and Guidance

For nomination to the Junior Fellowship of CORE Academy

1. Introductory Note

The International Core Academy of Sciences and Humanities welcomes nominations for Junior Fellowship from existing Fellows, members of the Academic Committee, and invited institutions or organizations.

Junior Fellowship of CORE Academy is a form of affiliated membership and honour conferred upon young scholars who demonstrate a high level of academic excellence and whose recent scholarly achievements show exceptional promise for making world-class contributions to knowledge in the future. Junior Fellowship is normally conferred for a maximum tenure of six years and does not constitute permanent membership in the Academy.

Junior Fellows are affiliated with one of the Academy's academic divisions and with the CORE Academy Institute (Ke Rui Academy), through which they are encouraged to participate in research programmes, academic initiatives, public engagement, and interdisciplinary exchange.

Nominations may be submitted across all divisions and disciplines of the Academy. There is no limit to the number of nominations that an eligible nominator may submit.

Election to the Junior Fellowship is subject to the Academy's nomination, peer-review, and approval procedures. Nomination does not guarantee election.

2. Eligibility and Basis for Nomination

Candidates for Junior Fellowship should normally meet the following criteria:

- the candidate is nominated by an existing Fellow, a member of the Academic Committee, or an invited institution or organization;
- the candidate is normally under the age of 45;
- the candidate has obtained a Ph.D. or equivalent degree;
- the candidate has published at least five peer-reviewed articles in internationally recognized journals or has authored a scholarly monograph;
- and the candidate has demonstrated strong potential for a high-impact academic career.

Some of the above criteria may be applied with appropriate flexibility in the humanities, engineering, and other relevant fields. In all cases, nominees should exhibit clear promise for future scholarly distinction and suitability for one or more of the Academy's academic divisions.

3. Review and Election Process

CORE Academy follows a nomination-based and peer-reviewed process for the election of Junior Fellows. The process normally proceeds as follows:

- (1) A candidate is nominated by an existing Fellow, a member of the Academic Committee, or an invited institution or organization.
- (2) The nomination materials are reviewed in the initial peer-review stage and may be circulated to relevant Fellows, reviewers, or committee members for confidential academic assessment.
- (3) The Academic Committee evaluates the nominee's scholarly achievements, academic standing, and overall suitability for Junior Fellowship.
- (4) The candidate is elected by a majority vote of the relevant members of the Academic Committee participating in the election process.
- (5) The election result is then submitted to the Executive Board for confirmation.
- (6) Upon confirmation, a formal notification or invitation is issued on behalf of the Academy. Junior Fellowship becomes effective upon the nominee's acceptance of the Academy's offer or invitation.

Nominations received after the current cut-off date for a given election cycle may still be welcomed and carried forward for consideration in a subsequent cycle.

4. Possible Outcomes

Following review, one of the following outcomes may arise:

- (1) Election to the Junior Fellowship of CORE Academy; or
- (2) Non-election in the current cycle.

If a nomination is not successful in the current cycle, the nominator may resubmit the candidate in a subsequent election cycle.

5. Confidentiality and Declaration of Interest

All nominations and supporting materials will be treated as confidential and used solely for the Academy's internal review and election process, except where confidential consultation is required for academic assessment.

Nominators, reviewers, and members involved in the assessment process are expected to disclose any significant conflict of interest, close professional collaboration, institutional connection, supervisory relationship, or personal relationship that may reasonably be seen as affecting impartial judgment.

6. Required Nomination Materials

Each nomination should include the following:

A. Nominee Information

- (1) Full name of nominee
- (2) Current academic or professional title
- (3) Current institutional affiliation
- (4) Country or region
- (5) Nominee's corresponding email
- (6) Proposed Academic Division / Field(s) / Research Interests

B. Nominator Information

- (1) Full name of nominator
- (2) Fellowship or membership number (optional)
- (3) Corresponding email
- (4) Signature (handwritten or valid electronic signature)

C. Nomination Statement

A nomination statement of approximately 600–1200 words is normally recommended, though longer statements may be accepted where necessary. The statement should normally address:

- the nominee’s academic, scientific, or scholarly background and present position;
- the nominee’s most significant achievements and original contributions to date;
- evidence of the nominee’s academic excellence and promise for future high-impact contributions;
- the significance and potential of the nominee’s work within the relevant field and, where appropriate, at the national, regional, or international level; and
- the nominee’s broader potential contribution to research, academic leadership, interdisciplinary exchange, education, public scholarship, or the activities of the Academy.

(Not every nomination will necessarily address all of the above in equal detail. Nominators are encouraged to focus on the aspects most relevant to the nominee’s field, career stage, and future scholarly promise.)

D. Supporting Materials and Additional Information (Optional)

Where available and appropriate, nominators are encouraged to provide supporting materials that may assist the Academy’s review. These may include:

- a brief proposed citation summarizing the nominee’s principal scholarly distinction and the main grounds for nomination;
- a selected list of the nominee’s most important publications, works, inventions, creative outputs, or other representative scholarly achievements relevant to the nomination;
- the nominee’s latest curriculum vitae;
- links to the nominee’s official homepage, departmental profile, Google Scholar, ORCID, or equivalent academic profile; and/or
- any other supporting academic documents or information relevant to the nomination, including major honors, awards, academy memberships, patents, exhibitions, performances, or public intellectual contributions.
