## Fellowship Nomination Form and Guidance

### *For nomination to Fellowship of CORE Academy (FCAcad)*

#### 1. Introductory Note

The International Core Academy of Sciences and Humanities welcomes nominations from existing Fellows for election to the Fellowship of the Academy.

Fellowship of CORE Academy is an international honour and senior membership conferred upon scholars who have demonstrated distinguished and sustained academic achievement over the course of their careers. Fellows are elected in recognition of their scholarly distinction, their original contributions to knowledge and research, and their broader impact on the international scholarly community.

Nominations may be submitted across all divisions and disciplines of the Academy. There is no limit to the number of nominations an existing Fellow may submit. While academic excellence remains the Academy's foremost criterion, the Academy also welcomes nominations that may help broaden its scholarly presence and representation across different countries, regions, and underrepresented fields.

Election to the Fellowship is subject to the Academy's nomination, peer-review, and approval procedures. Nomination does not guarantee election.

#### 2. Eligibility and Basis for Nomination

Candidates for Fellowship should normally demonstrate:

- distinguished and sustained academic achievement;
- original and significant contributions to scholarship, research, or intellectual life;
- recognized standing in their field or profession;
- evidence of impact within the relevant discipline, scholarly community, or wider society;
- suitability for inclusion within one or more of the Academy's academic divisions.

The Academy welcomes nominations from across the natural sciences, engineering and applied sciences, mathematics and information sciences, the humanities, the social sciences, and other relevant interdisciplinary or scholarly fields consistent with the Academy's mission.

### 3. Review and Election Process

CORE Academy follows a nomination-based and peer-reviewed process for the election of Fellows. The process normally proceeds as follows:

- (1) A candidate is nominated by an existing Fellow, or recommended by a member of the Academic Committee with the support of an existing Fellow.
- (2) The nomination materials are reviewed in the initial peer-review stage and may be circulated to relevant Fellows, reviewers, or committee members for confidential academic assessment.
- (3) The Academic Committee evaluates the nominee's scholarly achievements, academic standing, and overall suitability for Fellowship.
- (4) The candidate is elected by a majority vote of the relevant members of the Academic Committee participating in the election process.
- (5) The election result is then submitted to the Executive Board for confirmation.
- (6) Upon confirmation, a formal invitation is issued on behalf of the Academy. Fellowship becomes effective upon the nominee's acceptance of the Academy's formal invitation.

Nominations received after the current cut-off date for a given election cycle may still be welcomed and carried forward for consideration in a subsequent cycle.

### 4. Possible Outcomes

Following review, one of the following outcomes may arise:

- (1) Election to Fellowship of CORE Academy; or
- (2) Non-election in the current cycle.

If a nomination is not successful in the current cycle, the nominator may resubmit the candidate in a subsequent election cycle.

Where appropriate, and depending on the nominee's career stage, profile, or type of distinction, the Academic Committee or Executive Board may also recommend consideration for another category of recognition or membership of the Academy, such as Corresponding Fellowship, Junior Fellowship, Honorary Membership, or other distinctions as applicable.

## 5. Confidentiality and Declaration of Interest

All nominations and supporting materials will be treated as confidential and used solely for the Academy's internal review and election process, except where confidential consultation is required for academic assessment.

Nominators, reviewers, and members involved in the assessment process are expected to disclose any significant conflict of interest, close professional collaboration, institutional connection, supervisory relationship, or personal relationship that may reasonably be seen as affecting impartial judgment.

## 6. Required Nomination Materials

Each nomination should include the following:

### A. Nominee Information

- (1) Full name of nominee
- (2) Current academic or professional title
- (3) Current institutional affiliation
- (4) Country or region
- (5) Nominee's corresponding email
- (6) Proposed academic division / field(s) / research interest(s)

### B. Nominator Information

- (1) Full name of nominator
- (2) Membership number (optional)
- (3) Corresponding email
- (4) Signature (handwritten or valid electronic signature)

### C. Nomination Statement

A nomination statement of approximately 600–1200 words is normally recommended, though longer statements may be accepted where necessary. The statement should normally address:

- the nominee’s past and current academic, scientific, or scholarly career;
- the nominee’s most significant and original contributions to scholarship, research, or intellectual life;
- the significance and impact of those contributions within the field, and where relevant, at the national, regional, or international level;
- the nominee’s broader contribution to education, academic leadership, institution-building, mentorship, public scholarship, professional service, or other relevant forms of academic contribution.

(Not every nomination will necessarily address all of the above in equal detail. Nominators are encouraged to focus on the aspects most relevant to the nominee’s field, career profile, and principal scholarly distinction.)

## D. Supporting Materials and Additional Information (Optional)

Where available and appropriate, nominators are encouraged to provide supporting materials that may assist the Academy’s review. These may include:

- a brief proposed citation summarizing the nominee’s principal scholarly distinction and the main grounds for nomination;
- a selected list of the nominee’s most important publications, works, inventions, creative outputs, or other representative scholarly achievements relevant to the nomination;
- the nominee’s latest curriculum vitae;
- links to the nominee’s official homepage, departmental profile, Google Scholar, ORCID, or equivalent academic profile; and/or
- any other supporting academic documents or information relevant to the nomination, including major honors, awards, academy memberships, patents, exhibitions, performances, or public intellectual contributions.
